Genesis 3:14, "And the LORD God said unto the serpent, Because thou hast done this, thou [art] cursed above all cattle, and above every beast of the field; upon thy belly shalt thou go, and dust shalt thou eat all the days of thy life."

The above verse is the very first time the word "curse" or some form thereof is used in the Bible. A curse was brought upon the serpent because Satan had used this form. The serpent was cursed above all beasts of the field. This would make him hated and despised. Almost everyone has some dislike and fear of snakes and serpents.

The curse also caused the serpent to go upon his belly all the days of his life. He would eat dust. Certainly any snake you see does crawl upon the dust of the ground. This curse was brought because of sin.

In Genesis 3:16 we learn that woman would suffer the pain of child bearing. "Unto the woman he said, I will greatly multiply thy sorrow and thy conception; in sorrow thou shalt bring forth children; and thy desire [shall be] to thy husband, and he shall rule over thee. These conditions were placed upon woman because of the sin in the

garden. Though the word "curse" is not used in the above verse, it certainly is part of the curse brought upon mankind.

Genesis 3:17-19 shows the furtherance of the curse. "¹⁷And unto Adam he said, Because thou hast hearkened unto the voice of thy wife, and hast eaten of the tree, of which I commanded thee, saying, Thou shalt not eat of it: cursed [is] the ground for thy sake; in sorrow shalt thou eat [of] it all the days of thy life; ¹⁸Thorns also and thistles shall it bring forth to thee; and thou shalt eat the herb of the field; ¹⁹In the sweat of thy face shalt thou eat bread, till thou return unto the ground; for out of it wast thou taken: for dust thou [art], and unto dust shalt thou return." Man would have to toil to provide and eat. It would be difficult labor. The time here would ultimately end in death.

Without salvation from the LORD mankind would also lose his soul. No sin can enter Heaven. Revelation 21:27, "And there shall in no wise enter into it any thing that defileth, neither [whatsoever] worketh abomination, or [maketh] a lie: but they which are written in the Lamb's book of life."

In the midst of all these curses there is hope given. Genesis 3:15 shows hope. Someone is coming that would bruise the head of Satan, even though that someone would have His heel bruised. "And I will put enmity between thee and the woman, and between thy seed and her seed; it shall bruise thy head, and thou shalt bruise his heel."

As we study throughout the Bible, we learn that someone is Jesus. Jesus is never named in the Old Testament, but there are many prophecies referring to Him.

The very last word of the Old Testament is "curse." However there is great hope if you read the very next verse—the first verse of the New Testament. When you read the two verses back to back, you see the curse and immediately see the cure.

Malachi 4:6, "And he shall turn the heart of the fathers to the children, and the heart of the children to their fathers, lest I come and smite the earth with a curse."

Matthew 1:1, "The book of the generation of Jesus Christ, the son of David, the son of Abraham."

The very last chapter of the Bible is the last time "curse" is mentioned in the Bible.
