Micah 7:1-2, "¹Woe is me! for I am as when they have gathered the summer fruits, as the grapegleanings of the vintage: there is no cluster to eat: my soul desired the firstripe fruit. ²The good man is perished out of the earth: and there is none upright among men: they all lie in wait for blood; they hunt every man his brother with a net."

Micah felt like he was at harvest time and gathering the summer fruits and grapes, but yet there was nothing to eat. He felt this way concerning the faithful people of the LORD. He said the good man is perished out of the earth.

He goes on to say that all the leaders were corrupt and he could not trust in a friend nor even his wife. He talks of how children were dishonoring their parents.

Certainly Micah felt he had no where to turn. With all the evil and sin so open in the world, and perhaps even among those closest to us, where can we turn? Micah says in Micah 7:7, "*Therefore I will look*

unto the LORD; I will wait for the God of my salvation: my God will hear me?

I know with all the news and media we see that it's easy to feel like Micah. We feel all the righteous have gone from the earth and we are starving for spiritual things. We feel alone.

Elijah felt the same when he fled from the threats of Jezebel. He said he was alone. The last part of I Kings 19:14 says, ". . .*and I, even I* only, am left; and they seek my life, to take it away." But, he was not alone. The LORD told Elijah in I Kings 19:18, "Yet I have left me seven thousand in Israel, all the knees which have not bowed unto Baal, and every mouth which hath not kissed him." In the very next verse Elijah departed and found Elisha who would be with him in the LORD's work until the very moment that Elijah went to Heaven in a whirlwind.

Elijah was not alone nor was Micah. We are not alone either. We might feel overwhelmed with all the evil we see in the world. It seems there is no good remaining whatsoever, but there is. We need to turn to the LORD. Psalms 121:1, "*I will lift up mine eyes unto the hills, from whence cometh my help.*"

These promises are not only true, but they cannot be wrong. Paul told Titus that God cannot lie and that eternal life was promised before the world began.
