In August of 1986 there was a tragic natural disaster that occurred in the African nation of Cameroon. Over 1500 people lost their lives when volcanic gases escaped from under a lake and overtook three villages. A doctor on the scene noted that most who went outside to investigate died almost immediately. Those who stayed in, away from the gases, had a good chance of survival.

The same principle applies in the Christian life. When one steps outside the safety of righteous living and starts investigating sin, so often they are overtaken. Maybe in the back of their mind, they feel they will repent and turn back to the Lord before they die, but death comes sooner than expected or their hearts harden and there is no longer an interest in repentance.

We need to stay as far away from sin as possible. Heed the words of James 4:7, “*Submit yourselves therefore to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you.*”

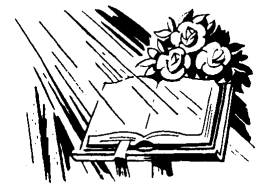

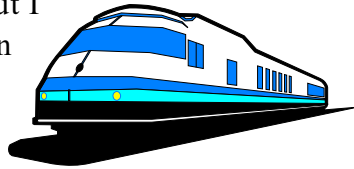
