

The Tree of Life

Genesis 3:22, 23 "And the LORD God said, Behold, the man is become as one of us, to know good and evil: and now, lest he put forth his hand, and take also of the tree of life, and eat, and live for ever: Therefore the LORD God sent him forth from the garden of Eden, to till the ground from whence he was taken."

The tree of life had been placed in the garden of Eden and we learn from Genesis 3:22 that if man ate of it, he would live forever. After sin entered the world, access to the tree of life was denied. is a tree of life; and he that winneth souls is wise." It seems from the reference to the winning of souls that the people we bring to the LORD is our fruit. In that sense we are a tree of life to the people who are saved due to our efforts.

The tree of life is again mentioned three times in Revelation. In Revelation 2:7 we are told that we will have access to the tree of life and where it is located, " To him that overcometh will I give to eat of the tree of life, which is in the midst of the paradise of God."

The last chapter of Revelation mentions the tree of life twice. Revelation 22:1, 2 "And he shewed me a pure river of water of life, clear as crystal, proceeding out of the throne of God and of the Lamb. In the midst of the street of it, and on either side of the river, was there the tree of life, which bare twelve manner of fruits, and yielded her fruit every month: and the leaves of the tree were for the healing of the nations."

The tree of life always has a variety of fresh fruit. Every month it bears this fruit and the leaves are for healing. The tree of life is there for the saved to freely enjoy and partake, and live forever.

The final time the tree of life is mentioned in the Bible is Revelation 22:14. This verse plainly tells who will access to the tree of life. "Blessed are they that do his commandments, that they may have right to the tree of life, and may enter in through the gates into the city."

Mankind was banished from the garden of Eden and lost access to the tree of life. The LORD in His mercy has made it available to the saved in Heaven. Obey the LORD and live for Him to have everlasting access to the tree of life.
