eternal. Paul wrote regarding the LORD's return in I Thessalonians 4:17, "*Then we which are alive and remain shall be caught up together with them in the clouds, to meet the Lord in the air: and so shall we ever be with the Lord.*"

When we go to be with the LORD we are ever with Him. It's interesting that Proverbs refers to the perfect day. The reference here has to be after this life since there is no perfect time here. How can it be referred to as one day and yet ever be with the LORD.

It's a day that never ends. It's a perfect day and it will never come to a close. It is eternal. We are told in Revelation 21:25 regarding Heaven, "And the gates of it shall not be shut at all by day: for there shall be no night there." Then in Revelation 22:5, "*And there shall be no night there; and they need no candle, neither light of the sun; for the Lord God giveth them light: and they shall reign for ever and ever.*"

It's a perfect day, because it's in Heaven. It's a "day" because there is no night there. It is eternal. The best possible day of all, which is perfect, will never end for us. As we read about this perfect day, we see just how perfect it is. Revelation 21:4 says, "And God shall wipe away all tears from their eyes; and there shall be no more death, neither sorrow, nor crying, neither shall there be any more pain: for the former things are passed away."

I can't help but wonder if John had a look of disbelief on his face. Himself— the One who was upon the throne. It's a comfort to know these things are true and were told to us by God who cannot lie Titus 1:12, "*In hope of eternal life, which God, that cannot lie, promised before the world began.*"

Three other times besides Revelation 21:5 the words "faithful" and "true" are used together. Revelation 3:14 calls Jesus the "faithful and true witness." This shows the things we are told in the Bible are true. He is a witness to these wonderful things in Heaven and is faithful and true.

In Revelation 19:11 Jesus is seated upon a white horse and He is called "Faithful and True." The fourth and final time the words "faithful" and "true" are used together is in Revelation 22:6. Right before the close of the Bible and the final words the LORD has for us on this side of eternity He says simply and plainly, "These sayings are faithful and true."

What hope and comfort this gives us as we walk the path of the just heading more and more unto this perfect day. The more I read about this perfect day, the more I can't wait to be there. I truly know I have *continued on next page...*
