Revelation 22:16, “. . . *I am the root and the offspring of David, and the bright and morning star.*”

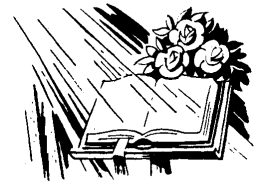
