## The Middle of the Bible

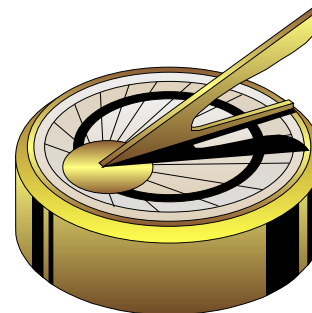
Did you know that . . .

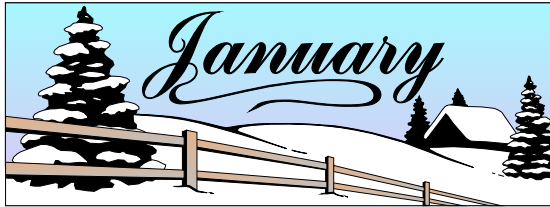
