Hebrews 4:12, *“For the word of God [is] quick, and powerful, and sharper than any twoedged sword, piercing even to the dividing asunder of soul and spirit, and of the joints and marrow, and [is] a discerner of the thoughts and intents of the heart.”*

The Greek word for “powerful” in the above verse is “energes.” It’s obvious from just a glance at the word that we get our word “energy” from that Greek work.

This time of year energy usage really begins to rise. We use more fuel to warm our homes and other buildings we use. Whether we use electricity or gas to heat and power appliances in our home, we have to keep a watch on usage. Energy costs are high. The gas to fuel our vehicles is the most expensive part of operating an automobile.

To further show how powerful the word of God is, Jesus said in John 10:35, *“If he called them gods, unto whom the word of God came, and the scripture cannot be broken.”* What a great comfort this is. We love and study the word and obey it. It will save our souls. We need never be concerned about it’s power abating or anything about it changing. Put all your hope and trust in the precious words of the Bible. You will be rewarded at the end. That is guaranteed. The scripture cannot be broken.
