Psalm 119:105, “*Thy word is a lamp unto my feet, and a light unto my path.*”

This is traditionally the time of year that people make resolutions. January 1 is really no different from any other day, but since it is the most major division in our calendar it makes this day a logical time to begin anew. People often resolve to better themselves. I suppose the top of the list is to lose weight, stop habits that are harmful, etc. The best resolution we can make would be to better ourselves for the LORD. Consider the two following areas in which we can better ourselves for the LORD.

1. Make sure you attend every service. There will be times that missing is truly unavoidable, but these should be few and far between. Ask yourself if the reason you are missing would be acceptable at work or school. Even if they are, the LORD deserves better than work and school. We only have three services a week for a total of four hours. That’s very little time compared to other activities. Make attendance a top priority. Make it a goal to not miss one service this year. The writer in Hebrews 10:25 says, “*Not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as the manner of*

some is; but exhorting one another: and so much the more, as ye see the day approaching.”

2. Read and study the Bible every day. We have so many things that take our time. Not only does work and school occupy a very high percentage of our time, but it’s easy to spend a few hours with entertainment. How much time per day or week do we spend studying the Bible?

The things we learn and study for this life are not eternal. They are for here and now. We are told by Jesus in John 12:48, “*He that rejecteth me, and receiveth not my words, hath one that judgeth him: the word that I have spoken, the same shall judge him in the last day.*” Knowing we will be judged by the words in the Bible, we need to know as much about them as possible.

How sad it is to go through this life never knowing all the LORD has to say to us in the Bible. A good question to ask oneself is, “Have I read the entire Bible?” If you have not, you should start immediately and make sure you know all the Bible has to say.

One can read the Bible in a year but it takes a few chapters per day to do so. With 1,189 chapters in the Bible you need to average about 3.25 chapters per day. With the Bible being available to listen to, you can easily do this during your daily commute or as you work around the house. If you listen to 12 minutes each day of Bible audio, you will finish the Bible well before the end of this year.

It’s sad to think how little the world knows about the Bible. It’s even more sad when you think about how easy it is to access the Bible. Not only are there paper copies in abundance, but the Bible is freely available to read or listen to on every computer or smart phone.

Be like those in Berea of whom we are told in Acts 17:11, “*These were more noble than those in Thessalonica, in that they received the word with all readiness of mind, and searched the scriptures daily, whether those things were so.*” —Marty Edwards❖
