What keeps gloom from overwhelming a lonesome shut-in?

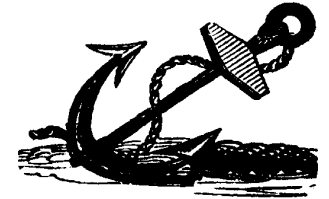
—The **hope** of a visitor
