3. The mad craze for pleasure; sports becoming every year more brutal, hence, more and more exciting.
4. The building of gigantic armaments, when the real enemy was within— the decadence of the people.
5. The decay of religion— faith fading into mere form. Losing touch with life, and becoming indifferent to guidance.

Think carefully about these five causes for the fall of a great nation. Perhaps it is much later than we think. Solomon said in Proverbs 14:34, "*Righteousness exalteth a nation: but sin is a reproach to any people.*"

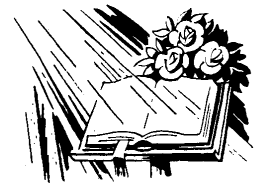
