

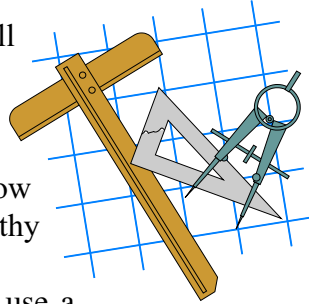

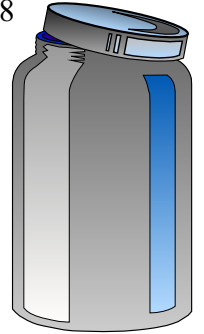

—The Church’s new website has been up two years this past week. It’s changed much since the first days it was online but has settled into regular and consistent content. (The first website for the Church came online in 1995 and we were one of the very first congregations of the Church to have a website.)

We post the weekly bulletin as well as keep an archive of the bulletin. You can tune in via computer or cell phone and listen to the audio of our services live. I am recording chapters weekly from the Bible and posting them for download or streaming play as mp3 files which will play on any computer, portable music device, or cell phone.

We have had hundreds of visitors over the past two years from all over the U. S. and many other countries. You can see on the world map when you log on where people are located that have been connecting. Dozens log in every day to hear the Bible being read.

Early this year we began archiving the audio of each service. Anyone with a newer cell phone, tablet, or computer, can go back and listen to each of our services.

The web site costs us just a few cents under \$96 per year and is no doubt one of the most effective means of evangelism we have.
