John 11:20, “*Then Martha, as soon as she heard that Jesus was coming, went and met him: but Mary sat [still] in the house.*”

In John 11 we have the account of where Jesus is returning to the place where Lazarus had died. Word came to Martha that Jesus was coming. When she heard this, she went out to meet Him.

I can’t help but think about how many people hear that Jesus is coming, yet do nothing to prepare to meet Him. We know that Jesus is coming again. When Jesus was returning to Heaven, the ones watching Him were told in Acts 1:11, “*Which also said, Ye men of Galilee, why stand ye gazing up into heaven? this same Jesus, which is taken up from you into heaven, shall so come in like manner as ye have seen him go into heaven.*”

Just two verses earlier we are told concerning Jesus in Acts 1:9, “*And when he had spoken these things, while they beheld, he was taken up; and a cloud received him out of their sight.*”

When Jesus returns, it will be in the clouds. Revelation 1:7, “*Behold, he cometh with clouds; and every eye shall see him, and they [also] which pierced him: and all kindreds of the earth shall wail because of him. Even so, Amen.*” Jesus will return in the clouds, and every eye shall see Him. That is not just the eyes of a few like when He ascended back into Heaven, but every eye.

It’s the eyes of those who are living as well as the eyes of all who have ever lived or have yet to be born. We know this because those who pierced Jesus will see Him. I feel John was told to write this because he would have seen this personally at the cross. No doubt it was a very hard event for John to see. They were cruelly piercing the body of the LORD after He had died. They and all humanity of all time, including us, will see Jesus when He returns.

Jesus will return in glory and with all His holy angels. Matthew 25:31, “*When the Son of man shall come in his glory, and all the holy angels with him, then shall he sit upon the throne of his glory.*” What a glorious sight to behold—Jesus returning in His glory with all the holy angels. We don’t know how many angels there are, but we get a general idea from Revelation 5:11, “*And I beheld, and I heard the voice of many angels round about the throne and the beasts and the elders: and the number of them was ten thousand times ten thousand, and thousands of thousands.*” That number alone if taken literally is 100 million, but there are thousands and thousands on top of that. When Jesus returns, the sky will be full.

Jesus will also come with all His saints. Paul wrote in I Thessalonians 3:13, “*To the end he may stablish your hearts unblameable in holiness before God, even our Father, at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ with all his saints.*” We know that the saints are the saved. Jesus, all His holy angels, and all His saints will be there at His coming in glory.

When Jesus comes, He is not coming to establish His kingdom. That was done on the day of Pentecost. We know it was established very
