

We post the weekly bulletin as well as keep an archive of the bulletin. You can tune in via computer or cell phone and listen to the audio of our services live. The entire Bible in mp3 files has been recorded and can be played or downloaded by chapter. They will play on any computer, portable music device, or cell phone. You can also just log on and hear the Bible being read. It's read in it's entirety three times per week approximately. It plays 24 hours per day and takes 68 hours to play the entire Bible.

You can also access a copy of our Wednesday lessons and the audio archives of each service. If you cannot attend or cannot listen live, the services are recorded and easily accessible for later listening. These are stored indefinitely and even years later can be accessed.

We have had hundreds of visitors over the past year from all over the U. S. and many other countries. You can see on the world map when you log on where people are located that have been connecting.

The web site will cost us \$117.86 for the next year which is 32.3 cents per day, and is no doubt one of the most effective means of evangelism we have.
