Proverbs 31:10, “*Who can find a virtuous woman? for her price [is] far above rubies.*”

Men seek out wealth and precious stones, but Proverbs tells us that a virtuous woman is far more precious than rubies. The word for rubies here was not just the red gem that we think of, it was a term for any precious stone. If you find a virtuous woman, you have found someone far more valuable than riches.

It’s interesting how Proverbs is constructed. The first six chapters spend much time talking about adultery and how ensnaring an evil woman is. No doubt Solomon wrote much about this because his 700 wives turned his heart from God. I Kings 11:4, “*For it came to pass, when Solomon was old, [that] his wives turned away his heart after other gods: and his heart was not perfect with the LORD his God, as [was] the heart of David his father.*”

Solomon had even gone as far as building places of worship for false gods. This was because he had married outlandish women. They literally were women from out of the land that did not value the

LORD and His word. Solomon had his heart turned from the LORD because of these women.

Solomon then closes out Proverbs talking about a virtuous woman. There is such a contrast between the women talked about in the first part of Proverbs and the woman in the last chapter of Proverbs. The construction of Proverbs is interesting in how it’s laid out. It opens with warning of evil women and closes with how valuable a virtuous woman is. Of course these passages go both ways. There are evil men and virtuous men, but Solomon was writing to his son and warning him of these dangers.

These thoughts apply to either a man or a woman about to get married. The most important quality in a spouse is to be a Christian. When you are married to a non-Christian, you are yoked with someone who is pulling in the opposite direction of the only thing that truly matters—serving the LORD. It truly would be better to spend one’s life alone than to be with someone who is going to pull you away from the LORD. Solomon would have been far better off with one God-fearing wife than hundreds of wives that turned his heart from the LORD.

Proverbs is certainly filled with many other points of wisdom. There are so many verses about watching what we say and controlling our tongues. There is general everyday advice that will keep us close to the LORD and away from sin.

No doubt so much was written to his son about wives, because Solomon saw how his wives turned him from the LORD. A spouse is someone we are with all our lives. Let’s spend those decades with someone who shares the same love for the LORD—someone who will ultimately help us get to Heaven.
