March Forth

omorrow is March 4th, which is the only day of the year that is a "command." On this day we are told to "March forth." As members of the Lord's body, we are to continually march forth and onward ever growing in the Lord and spreading the borders of the Lord's kingdom.

Luke 2:52 is a verse regarding Jesus when He was a young man that exemplifies the growing and marching onward we need to have as Christians. This verse says, "And Jesus increased in wisdom and stature, and in favour with God and man."

As we "march forth" through our journey here, let's do as the Lord when He was a young man and increase and better ourselves in these four areas:

1. **Wisdom** — The primary definition of "wisdom" according to the American Heritage Dictionary is "Understanding of what is true, right, or lasting; insight." The second definition simply states, "common sense, good judgment."

We all know what wisdom is, but also know it's hard to practice. Solomon had wisdom above all other people, but he did not always utilize it. To have wisdom and not use it is analogous to having a hammer with you, but using a rock to drive a nail. You might as well not have the

hammer if you never use it. Likewise, wisdom, unused, is wasted.

How does one obtain wisdom? Certainly, we learn from our past as we go through life. By sheer experiences, we learn not to repeat certain courses of action, but the child of God has another way to obtain wisdom— ask for it. We are told in James 1:5, "*If any of you lack wisdom, let him ask of God, that giveth to all [men] liberally, and upbraideth not; and it shall be given him.*"

The fifth, and final definition, of "wisdom" in the particular dictionary I used just simply states, "Bible. Wisdom of Solomon." Study those whose experiences are recorded in the pages of the Bible to learn from them and grow in wisdom.

Wisdom can keep us out of trouble, keep us on the right path in life, and ultimately, help us obtain a home in Heaven. Let's pray for wisdom often as we **march forth** toward our eternal destiny.

2. **Stature** — Stature is the physical growing of one's body. The Lord has given us bodies to be able to live in this physical world. We are certainly obligated to take care of it as much as is within us. Granted, there are many things beyond our control, but so many damage their bodies with activities that are completely within their control.

Paul wrote in I Timothy 4:8, "For bodily exercise profiteth little: but godliness is profitable unto all things, having promise of the life that now is, and of that which is to come." Although bodily exercise does profit little, note that he did not say that it is of no profit. Although bodily exercise profits little when compared to the eternal scheme of things, there is still some profit in it.

A sound body helps one's attitude and outlook on life. Let's do all we can to take care of the vessel the Lord has given us. Let's **march forth** toward a more healthy existence here.

3. Favor with God — As Jesus was growing up, He increased in favor with God. At the young and tender age of 12, He was found in the temple discussing advance spiritual matters. His interest in the work of the Lord began early. Even though He was the son of God, no doubt, the way his earthly parents reared him made a real difference.

Make sure your children are at the worship services, Bible classes, and are exposed continuously to the teachings of God's word. Though secular education is of vast importance, and I recommend as much education as possible, make sure they are first and foremost educated in the Lord.
