hree years ago in 2011 during this week there was the fifth largest earthquake recorded since 1900 under the Pacific Ocean off the coast of Japan. It was so powerful that the Earth was moved on it's axis. Soon



afterwards, a tsunami with 23 foot waves moving at nearly 600 miles per hour crashed into the coast of Japan, moving the coast of Japan 8 feet.

I could not help but notice during much of the footage how people quickly and instantly changed what they were doing that morning. They left behind businesses, homes, and automobiles, and in most cases, these items left the people behind as the material things were literally swept away.

Many perished in this event and no doubt many were swept back out to sea to never be found.

There are many spiritual lessons which can be learned from this event.

- 1. Life is fragile and death can come quickly. No one had any idea what was about to happen to them. They knew the were going to die—someday. They just didn't expect it to be last week.
- 2. **Material things are unimportant.** Within moments, houses and possessions were washed away. There were reports of entire villages being destroyed. People work hard, and often will go to extreme measures, to build up material possessions, but in a moment, they can be literally swept away.
- 3. We are richly blessed. Some of the most needed things of the people in the hardest hit areas are some of the things we take for granted. They have no electricity, no clean water, and extremely unsanitary conditions. We can go to the kitchen sink and get a virtually endless supply of what many of them need most, but do not have.
- 4. **It's easy to overlook impending danger.** There was no warning of the earthquake and little or no warning of the tsunami. Even ships on the ocean would not have noticed it because the force is underneath the surface of the water until it hits the shore.
  - So many things in life are like that. There are situations, associates, things we do, places we visit, that are filled with hidden spiritual dangers. If we are not watchful and vigilant, they will overwhelm us like flood waters.
- 5. **People do not heed warnings.** Many often complain when there are natural events such as this that the government did not do more to warn them. Even if the technology had been there to give advance warning, most people would not have evacuated thinking it would not effect them or it would not be as bad as they said it would be.
