Amos 8:11, "Behold, the days come, saith the Lord GOD, that I will send a famine in the land, not a famine of bread, nor a thirst for water, but of hearing the words of the LORD."

The LORD warned through Amos that a famine was coming. Amos was a farmer and could relate to the destruction brought about by a famine. He knew what the lack of food and water would cause. As much as a famine of food and water causes destruction, a famine of the word of God is even more devastating.

The LORD said He would send a famine of the hearing of the words of the LORD. The LORD wants all to hear His word and makes it available, but because of their sins and rejection of His word, a famine of hearing those words would be sent.
