n April of 1912 the Titanic sank. The British ocean liner had been labeled by the builders as "unsinkable." The ship was making its first voyage which was in the North Atlantic. The total loss of life numbered 1,513.

The ones commenting said that if a better grade of steel had been used, many more would have survived. I couldn't help but think even if the ship had NOT sunk, they still would not be alive now because it was 100 years ago and they would have died in that time anyway.
