Revelation 11:17, "Saying, We give thee thanks, O Lord God Almighty, which art, and wast, and art to come; because thou hast taken to thee thy great power, and hast reigned."

This Thursday is Thanksgiving Day. It's a holiday in the United States where everyone is encouraged to pause and give thanks for the many blessings we have. It's usually a day with a huge meal and family gatherings.

food.

We too are to give thanks for food. Paul wrote in I Timothy 4:3-5, "³Forbidding to marry, [and commanding] to abstain from meats, which God hath created to be received with thanksgiving of them which believe and know the truth. ⁴For every creature of God [is] good, and nothing to be refused, if it be received with thanksgiving: ⁵For it is sanctified by the word of God and prayer."

He was warning of groups to come that would forbid marriage and command not to eat certain meats. Under the old law, they could not eat certain foods. This restriction was removed with the New Testament. Paul tells us that every creature is good, and not to be refused, if it's received with thanksgiving. Any food is sanctified by God's word and prayer. When we pray for our food, we are sanctifying it. Never eat a meal without giving thanks unto the LORD.

Not only are we blessed with food in abundance and choices of good food, but it's always available. We can go to the grocery and find most anything we want in stock. We don't just simply go and find bread, but there are all types of bread. The abundance is beyond what many people of other places and times could not imagine.
