II Timothy 4:4-5, “*4For every creature of God [is] good, and nothing to be refused, if it be received with thanksgiving: 5For it is sanctified by the word of God and prayer.*”

This Thursday our nation celebrates a national holiday, Thanksgiving. It’s a day set aside years ago to remember from whence all our blessings come and to give thanks. Of course we are to always have this spirit of thanksgiving and to continually give thanks for what we have. We can divide our blessings into two categories— spiritual and material.

In my life, we produced our own meat and produce, but now that we do not, there is still abundance. Probably not one of us can say we have truly been hungry.

Water. When giving thanks, I think we often focus upon the food we have and maybe not give as much thought as to how wonderful the blessing of clean water is. It’s something we need to always be thankful for.

Our material blessings pale in comparison to our spiritual blessings. The spiritual blessings we have are only for those in the LORD. Ephesians 1:3, “*Blessed [be] the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who hath blessed us with all spiritual blessings in heavenly [places] in Christ.*” We see from this verse that all spiritual blessings are in Christ. If one is out of the LORD there are no spiritual blessings.

There are so many spiritual blessings to talk about that space here does not permit such a discussion. Consider a few.

Salvation. The forgiveness of our sins is the greatest blessing of all. The opportunity to be saved was bought by Jesus’s death upon the cross. There is no way we could have been able to avoid being eternally lost without His precious blood shed for us.

Only Jesus can provide this freedom. Revelation 1:18, “*I [am] he that liveth, and was dead; and, behold, I am alive for evermore, Amen; and have the keys of hell and of death.*” Jesus was dead, but is now forever alive. He has the keys of hell and death. He is the only one that can free us from that eternal destiny.

Heaven. The older I get the more I think about the blessings in Heaven. Just reading Revelation 21 and 22 makes me more eager with each passing day to be with the LORD eternally.
