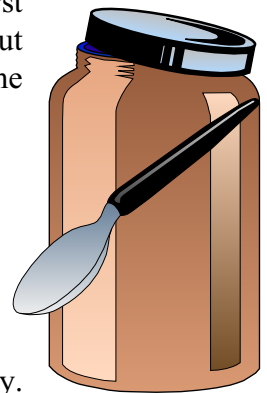
Bottom of the Peanut Butter Jar

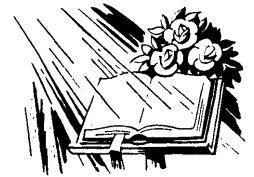
