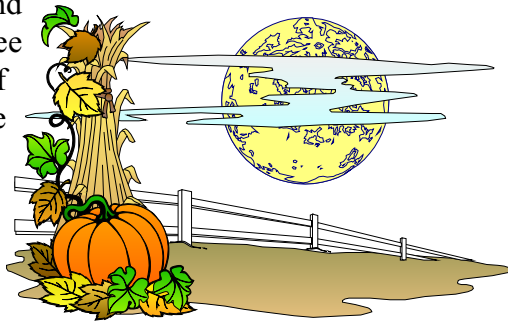

There will be a harvest time. Consider the seed you are sowing. It will come forth abundantly in time of harvest.

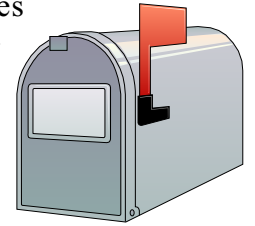
