Acts 19:19-20, “¹⁹Many of them also which used curious arts brought their books together, and burned them before all men: and they counted the price of them, and found it fifty thousand pieces of silver. ²⁰So mightily grew the word of God and prevailed.”

There is no shortage of books in the world. Libraries are overflowing. Bookstores often have stacks of books all over the floor. Websites that sell or rent electronic books often state how many millions of titles they have.

When all is said and done, we only need one book—the Bible. There is no other book whereby you can find how to save your soul and to live eternally with God in Heaven. I like to picture a vast library with all empty shelves expect for one book—the Bible.

In Acts 19 those turning to God brought books that contained things that would have been contrary to the word of God and burned them. It was an expensive sacrifice. Paul wrote in I Corinthians 1:18, *“For the preaching of the cross is to them that perish foolishness; but unto us which are saved it is the power of God.”* The preaching of the cross is Christ and Him crucified.
